We had 12 shooters today and with that, some respectable scores. You would think that a score of 43 out of 48 would be pretty darn good. I mean that is 89.5% efficiency, and has won matches in the past. Today?.....NOPE! That was dead last place. Again.....Amazing!

Top dog today was.....(insert drum roll here).......

48/48 – Tony, aka "Turk", shooting an FX Crown Bee.....whatever that is. It looked to be yellow and black laminated stock.....and was purdy looking.....for a puffer gun.

47/48 – Nathan, aka "Doc", drove down from Flagstaff to avoid winter and shot his Thomas.....and was tied with.....

47/48 – Mike, aka "double bagger", who shot his Thomas.

We have targets that have an aluminum tab, mounted on the paddle. These tabs are meant to be a sacrificial......"anode"....... that would take the brunt of all the high velocity puffer gun pellet hits. When hammered to death, these tabs then get replaced. Well, on this one particular target, the tab has not been replaced.....yet. So, the steel paddle has a drilled 3/16" (.1875) hole where the steel rivet would pass through to secure the tab to the paddle. This one was missing. Now a .177 pellet WILL pass thru this hole......barely. There is .0100" clearance, or .0050"/per side clearance each side of a pellet. That is 5 thousandths of an inch. See where I am going with this? No less than 6 out of the 12 shooters SWORE that their pellet passed through this hole.....CLEANLY..... without touching the paddle, and thus failed to drop the target. Also note that only one person cleaned the course. There is a term to describe this phenomenon.....

I don't know if these misses were scored as hits or not.....don't care.....we had fun and the laughter that ensued afterwards will keep us all young and healthy. Such is the power of humor.
